2019 PX3 WINNERS:

Gabriele Cecconi, won the competition's top award with his moving photographic series, **"The Wretched and the Earth"**. The work took the top prize in the professional **Press** category and earned him the coveted title of **"Photographer of the Year"** and a \$5,000 cash prize.

In August 2017, almost 1 million Rohingya flocked to Bangladesh, fleeing persecution in their country of origin, Myanmar. The project aim to investigate the environmental impact of a sudden mass migration delineating the intersection of two very pressing narratives: people struggling to survive with few precious resources, and the impact of the refugee crisis on an already beleaguered ecosystem.
